About the LGBTQA conversion practices ban



LGBTQA conversion practices are harmful practices which seek to change or suppress an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity. They are sometimes referred to as 'gay conversion' practices or 'conversion therapy'.

From 4 April 2025, conversion practices are banned in NSW. You can report conversion practices to Anti-Discrimination NSW, which can help resolve complaints through conciliation.








Anti-Discrimination NSW has developed an Easy Read guide that explains LGBTQA conversion practices and the ban.







Harmful LGBTQA conversion practices, which seek to change or suppress an individual's sexual orientation or gender identity, are now banned in NSW.

The Conversion Practices Ban Act 2024 came into effect on 4 April 2025 and prohibits LGBTQA conversion practices in NSW. It creates criminal offences for delivering or performing conversion practices which will be overseen by NSW Police and a new civil complaints scheme which will be administered by Anti-Discrimination NSW.

Conversion practices, which are sometimes referred to as 'gay conversion' practices or 'conversion therapy', are based on the false ideology that there is something wrong or broken about people with diverse sexualities or gender identities.

Everyone deserves to be respected for who they are.

Anti-Discrimination NSW have developed <u>resources</u> containing information about conversion practices, the new civil complaints scheme and support services available to provide further help where needed.
